<b>P487</b>	<b>Women Skill's Development &amp; Microfinance</b> Host club amount: \$100 Total project amount: \$125,862 Description: Part 1 – To provide vocational training in the fields of tailoring, computers, cooking, embroidery, handicraft and beautician. <b>P490</b>	<b>Micro-credit Program for Women</b> Host club amount: \$100 Total project amount: \$30,023 Description: This is a 14-month project for which the cooperating organization in the host country is South Kolkata Nari Jagriti. The project will provide microcredit, small loans of \$50-100 U.S. per woman, to 300-500 (who have not received microcredit previously) so they can use the same for productive employment. These women will also be provided skill development training so that they can use those skills for self employment.	<b>Calcutta Uptown, India/D3291</b>
<b>P491</b>	<b>Reproductive Education- High School Teenagers</b> Host club amount: \$10, 000 Total project amount: \$52,000 Description: This program is designed to provide teenagers (girls and boys) awareness and clear information on risky behaviors and protective measures for the prevention of pregnancies and makes emphasis on Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) and Human Papilloma Virus (HPV; because the Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome (AIDS) and the Uterine Cervical Cancer are among the major causes for women mortality in Columbia between 15-44 years. These two occupy the 3 <sup>rd</sup> and 4 <sup>th</sup> place as causes for maternal mortality.	<b>Small Towns, Columbia/D4290</b>
